Earn Your Master's Degree for FREE

Have you thought about putting your STEM degree to use as a teacher?

The Albany State University School of Education is a National Science Foundation (NSF) grant recipient of the Robert Noyce Teachers Scholarship.

The ASU Noyce Teaching Fellows program is open to graduates with an undergraduate degree in a STEM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics) field, who have never been employed as a teacher, and are willing to teach in a high-need public school for a minimum of 2 years for each year they receive funding from the grant.

ASU Noyce Teaching Fellows receive:

- Funding for a master's degree, including tuition, fees, room and board
- A \$50,000 salary supplement during the first four years of qualifying teaching service

ASU Noyce Teaching Fellows must:

- Complete academic requirements to earn a master's degree with certification, including certification exams
- Maintain a 3.0 GPA
- Commitment to teach in a high-need public school for a minimum of four years

The ASU Noyce Teaching Fellows Program begins May 2021:

- Participants will earn a master's degree with initial certification in 15 months (summer 2021, fall 2021, spring 2022, summer 2022).
