As an International Solidarity Coordinator with the Black Women's Mobilization for the Care of Life and Ancestral Territories he has organized dozens of presentations, workshops, and information sessions on Afro-Colombian and Black land struggles in Latin America. As a member of the Coordinating Committee of the Afro-Colombian Solidarity Network, Manuel coordinates fundraisers, call-in campaigns, and travel delegations in support of black land rights in Colombia. His research focuses on the politics of black collective land ownership examined through the poetic-politics of land and territoriality in black women's writing and political organizing, with special attention to work, labor and mothering.

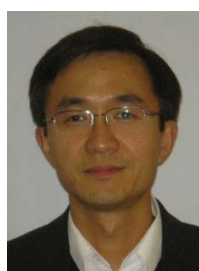

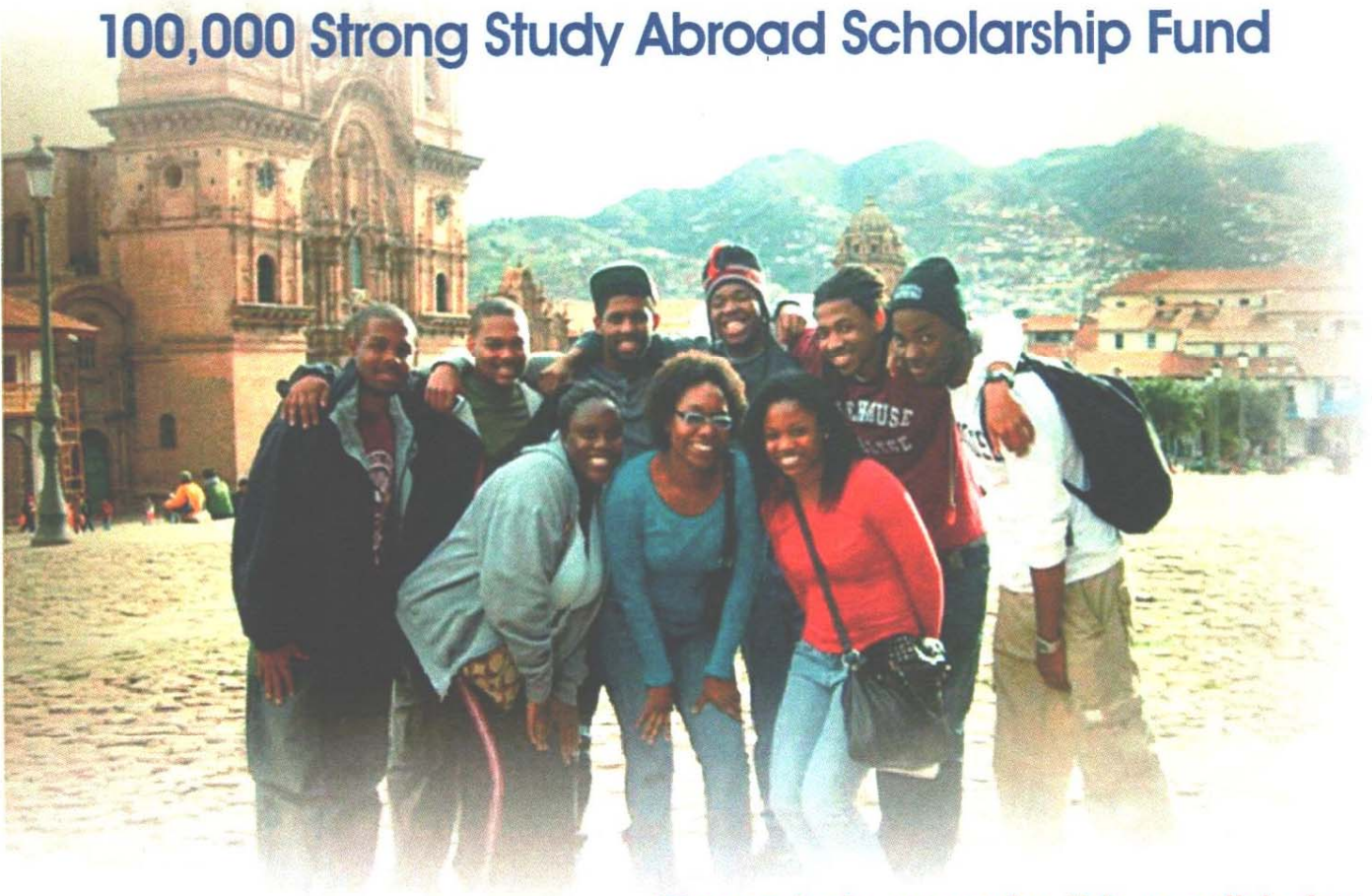
