His research focuses on the politics of black collective land ownership examined through the poetic-politics of land and territoriality in black women's writing and political organizing, with special attention to work, labor and mothering.



Growing up and being ill most of her life, but that did not stop her charismatic charm and persevering attitude. She is currently a Junior at Albany State University where she studies Speech and Theatre. You might recognize her for her stellar performance as the first female Mercutio in Albany State University's production of Romeo and Juliet.
