



Albany State University is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for all members of the campus community. In accordance with the Clery Act, we publish statistical information regarding criminal or alleged criminal activity that is reported to the University Police and surrounding agencies, the arrest and referrals for disciplinary action statistics, on campus residential fire statistics, and the Annual Security and Fire Safety Report.

Daily Crime Log: The Albany State University Police Department maintains a public log of all crimes reported to University Police. The Daily Crime Log includes the nature, date, time, general location, and disposition of each reported crime.

Timely Warnings: the Albany State University Police Department will issue Timely Warnings, as soon as the pertinent information is available, for any Clery Act crimes that the University determines represent an ongoing threat to the safety of students, employees or the University Community.

Emergency Notifications: the Albany State University Police Department will, without delay, and considering the safety of the community, issue an Emergency Notification upon the confirmation of a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health or safety of students, employees or University Community.

Albany State University compiles an Annual Security and Fire Safety Report by October 1 that contains a summary of campus security policies and specific crime statistics.

- Albany State University must provide a notice to all enrolled students and current employees that includes a statement of the report's availability, description of the contents, exact URL where the report is posted and how to obtain a printed copy of the report.
- Albany State University must provide a notice to prospective students and prospective employees that includes a statement of the report's availability, description of the contents, exact URL where the report is posted and how to obtain a printed copy of the report.

Understanding the Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act



CLERY ACT & CRIME REPORTING

What are Clery Reportable Crimes? Clery Reportable Crimes include those offenses reported to the Albany State University Police Department, local law enforcement agencies, and designated Campus Security Authorities (including but not limited to directors, deans, department heads, housing staff, judicial affairs, advisors to student/student organizations, and athletic coaches).

- Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter
- Manslaughter by Negligence
- Rape
- Fondling
- Incest
- Statutory Rape
- Robbery
- Burglary
- Aggravated Assault
- Motor Vehicle Theft
- Arson
- Hate Crimes

What is a hate crime? A hate crime is a criminal offense committed against a person or property because of the victim's race, gender, religion, ethnicity, or sexual orientation. It is a crime motivated by bias or prejudice against a particular group.

What is Hazing? Hazing is defined as any intentional, knowing, or reckless act committed by a person (whether individually or in concert with other persons) against another person or persons regardless of the willingness of such other person or persons to participate, that (1) is committed in the course of an initiation into, an affiliation with, or the maintenance of membership in, a student organization (e.g., a club, athletic team, fraternity, or sorority); and (2) causes or creates a risk, above the reasonable risk encountered in the course of participation in the IHE or the organization, of physical or psychological injury.

What is Clery Geography? Clery Geography is the geographic area for which Albany State University is responsible for disclosing crime statistics. The following areas describe Albany State University's Clery Geography:

- On-Campus Residential: Inside residential halls.
- On-Campus: Everywhere else on campus.
- Non-Campus: Buildings or property owned and/or controlled by Albany State University that is used in direct support of/in relation to educational purposes, is frequently used by students and is not within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the university.
- Public Property that is within, or immediately adjacent to, and accessible from the campus.

Non-campus geography pertains to buildings or property owned or controlled by the institution that are not reasonably contiguous to an on-campus buildings or property, yet still frequently used by students and used for educational purposes. Albany State University has no officially recognized non-campus student organizations or student housing facilities.

What is a Campus Security Authority? The Clery Act designates a Campus Security Authority as an individual who, by virtue of their university responsibilities, is designated to receive and report criminal incidents to the Albany State University Police Department.

- Campus police department
- Any individual or individuals who have responsibility for campus security but who do not constitute a campus police department or a campus security department
- Any individual or organization specified in an institution's statement of campus security policy as an individual or organization to which students and employees should report criminal offenses.
- An official of an institution who has significant responsibility for student and campus activities.



Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act was signed by President Obama.

What are VAWA Crimes? The Violence Against Women Act crime statistics are included in the Clery Reportable Crimes. These crimes include:

- Domestic Violence: violence committed by a person who is a current or former spouse or intimate partner of the victim, is cohabitating, or has cohabitated, with the victim or shares a child in common with the victim.
- Dating Violence: violence committed by a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim.
- Stalking: engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for his or her safety or the safety of others; or suffer substantial emotional distress.

How are victims protected? Under the Clery Act, any student or employee who becomes a victim of dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking (whether on or off campus) has the right to receive written explanation of their rights and options. Victims are protected against retaliation by an institution, officer, employee, or agent of an institution for exercising their rights under the Clery Act.

What is retaliation? Retaliation includes: intimidation, threats, coercion, discrimination, or any other form of retaliation.
